1. Designing training pilots

MUHEC coordinated the training pilots following the Train-the-Trainers (TtT) workshop delivered in February 2022 in London. It was decided that sample pilot trials would be organised on the side of the project meeting held in Tirana on April 2022, before the full training pilots were delivered in Palermo and Cagliari during the summer of 2022.

The consortium ensured that a sufficient number of trainers was provided by each PCI. MUHEC proposed a higher number of trainees (up to 10) for the online training programme, as the sessions were going to be delivered in hybrid mode. Therefore, more staff could be trained remotely. The consortium agreed that it was critical to adhere to travel budget for trainees who would attend the London refresher training that was held in May 2022.

The following table shows the original schedules for the training pilot delivery that were finally adjusted accordingly based on the project's viable travel schedule that was still affected by COVID19 at the time.












































2. Conducting training pilots

MUHEC suggested that trainers should to be classified to those who were able to deliver TtT and those who are Subject Matter Experts (SMEs). The consortim agreed that TtT trainers would be INTERBA champions and coordinate how local trainings would take place. SME trainers should be experienced in previous projects and would offer specific training sessions. The same individuals could combine TtT and SME trainer role/status.

Three training pilots were conducted as shown below.

2.1. Training pilot 1 (Tirana, Albania)

During the INTERBA management meeting that was organised during 11-14 April, 2022 at the premises of the University of Tirana, sample pilot training was delivered. Durign themeeting the consortium covered project management, work packages progress, trainings, Training of Trainers, and study visits discussion among the partners. In addition, pilot trainings were presented by all six partner universities from the three countries (Bosnia and Herzegovina, Albania, and Kosovo) under the monitoring of colleagues from universities in Germany, Italy, and England.































2.2. Training pilot 2 (Cagliari, Italy)

In the framework of Work Package 4 of the INTERBA project, a three-day meeting was organised in Cagliari, Sardinia during 13-15 July 2022. Representatives from all project partners attended the meeting. The purpose was to pilot the trainings, created under Work Package 3 from partner countries. University of Tirana, Universum College and University of Prishtina presented two pilot trainings each, which were developed according to the SCATE methodology, introduced from Middlesex University during Train the Trainers in London in February 2022.

The topics of the trainings included:

- 1. "Online communication platforms and online collaboration", held by Prof. Dr. Blerim Rexha, University of Prishtina
- 2. "Blue Economy and Sustainability" held from Prof. Asoc. Dr. Ermelinda Kordha Tolica, University of Tirana
- 3. "Social Enterprise Business Ideas" held by Prof. Shqipe Rashiti, Universum College
- 4. "Digital Marketing" held by Prof. Arlinda Qehaja, Universum College
- 5. "Achieving gender equality through gender equality plans and gender budgeting", by Dr. Linda Gjika (Cepani), University of Tirana
- 6. "Research methodologies in ICT" by Hena Maloku, University of Pristina

Also, during the three day meeting, Train the Trainers program was re-introduced by Professor George Dafoulas, from Middlesex University.

2.3. Training pilot 3 (Palermo, Italy)

The follow-up training pilot from Cagliari was also held in the framework of Work Package 4 of the INTERBA project, a three-day meeting was organised in Palermo, Italy during 18-20 July 2022. Representatives from all project partners attended the meeting. The purpose was to pilot the trainings, created under Work Package 3 from partner countries. European University of Tirana, University of Tuzla and Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar presented two pilot trainings each, which were developed according to the SCATE methodology, introduced from Middlesex University during Train the Trainers in London in February 2022.


3. Evaluating training pilots



How would you rate the training agenda?





























How would you rate the training content?




How would you rate the use of train-storming sessions?

How would you rate the use of the training portfolio?






































How would you rate the training content?




How would you rate the use of train-storming sessions?






















How would you rate the training venue?




How would you rate the training agenda?

How would you rate the training content?





























How would you rate the use of train-storming sessions?
